Windsor Workshop, Toronto, 2 – 5 June 2003

Natural Resources Canada, U.S. Department of Energy and the International Energy Agency are hosting an international workshop on emerging transport technologies, systems and policies. I would like to invite you to the workshop and to submit a proposal for a paper.

The Windsor Workshop will celebrate its 20th Anniversary, 2 – 5 June 2003 by providing a broad, global event, which will cover issues that touch on all aspects of transport. International experts from the public and private sector in all fields of research, policy, fuel supply and vehicle manufacturing will compare experiences, share information and look to the future of the transport industry. Topics to be covered include technologies related to efficiency, materials, engines, power plants and vehicles; fuels including bio-fuels and alternatives; fuelling infrastructure; transportation policies and programmes; regulations and standards; and transportation systems.

The Workshop is requesting abstracts for presentations, in addition to presentations by direct invitation. Approximately 40 papers from the abstracts received will be selected for the main programme. Additional papers will be considered for poster-sessions and cancellations.
