



## **NEW FREE ACCESS TO ETDEWEB FOR NON-IEA COUNTRIES**

Close to forty developing countries now have free access to the IEA Energy Technology Data Exchange (ETDE) database. By simply registering in ETDEWEB, countries can leverage ETDE's immense store of knowledge relating to energy policies and technologies that can raise living standards, meet environmental challenges and hasten the pace of technological and commercial development. Countries can also input information. ETDE will encourage them to contribute their own information to the database, both to improve the coverage of the database and to offer scientists and researchers in the developing world a means of reaching a global audience.

ETDE, an IEA Implementing Agreement programme since 1987, previously permitted database access to the programme's 16 member countries only. ETDEWEB provides access to over 3.3 million records on worldwide energy-related research and development, as well as immediate access to over 100,000 electronic, full-text reports, conference papers and selected journal articles. It offers links to thousands more documents residing on other websites round the world. Users can read about current energy and environment technologies and topics such as fuel cells, energy conservation and efficiency, renewables, nuclear energy, greenhouse gas reduction, alternative fuels, and climate-change, environmental, economic, and policy issues.
