Nancy Turck was appointed Chief Legal Counsel at the International Energy Agency on 4 March 2002.

Ms. Turck, a U.S. and British national, is a member of the New York Bar and of the Supreme Court of England and Wales. Prior to joining the IEA, she practiced law in law firms in New York City, Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, Dubai, United Arab Emirates and London, United Kingdom. She has specialized in commercial transactions, with a focus on oil and gas matters, and in international commercial arbitration as arbitration counsel and as an arbitrator. She has written many law review articles on various aspects of Middle East law and on the classification of crude oil contracts under U.S. and English law. She is active in the International Bar Association, including being a Council member in the Section on Energy, Environment, Natural Resources and Infrastructure Law (SEERIL) and a former co-chair of the Forum on Middle East law.

Ms. Turck has a Bachelor and a Masters Degree in Political Science from Brown University, Providence, Rhode Island and a LLB from Georgetown University's Law Centre, Washington, D.C.
